### **Building and Grounds Report**

A December to remember they called it....and then more of the same in January, February, and March. Needless to say, we're looking forward to spring here in Small Point, and I have vowed never to complain about mowing a lawn ever again. NOT EVER...NUFF SAID! So let's move on to thoughts of spring, and our plans for improving SPSS buildings and grounds this season.

We are still on track to finally clean and brighten up the bathrooms and hall under the barn. We will clean up the mildew and remove the old shower stalls from the bathroom floors (yes, that's what those unsightly things are), and then we will finish the floors, walls, and wood stalls with a hardy

mildew resistant paint. The result should be much brighter, cleaner facilities for us all to use this summer.

We will also continue to attend to old Sprague Hall and all the needed repairs and restoration. By the start of camp this year we are scheduled to have new shingles on the gable end at the library entrance where the exterior siding has been rotten and broken for years.
